



guide to finding the right instructor:

If you cannot find the right match with an instructor at Lucci Music, we want to make sure you have all of the available information to find a teacher who can help you achieve your goals. The following are 5 fundamental aspects you should consider when looking for a teacher or school.

1. Teachers that go beyond private one-on-one instruction

Most importantly, you want a school that offers you the ability to additionally join group or performance lessons, attend clinics, and have [access to more information](#) throughout the practice week. Lucci Music provides you with all of these, and as our student, you will have member's only access to our private forum where you can ask questions and read and post on important practicing and learning topics. All of our instructors are highly active on the forums.

2. Mentoring, guiding, and instructing (not cookie-cut lesson plans)

Your teacher should care about your personal (musical) growth, and make each student's goals a priority. A good teacher will share his/her knowledge with the student, personally mentor the student, and also guide the student to the [right information, in the right order, at the right time](#). Lucci Music instructors work collectively to refine their proven teaching methods and set up a lesson plan and goals for each individual student. We know that [you are unique](#), and no two students are alike.

3. Teachers who are continually growing (no one knows it all)

A good teacher is someone who always looks humbly from the beginner's perspective, has a willingness to learn new things, refine their knowledge, and continue their musical education. Lucci Music instructors continue to grow with [their personal mentors](#), expand their musical education, and teach each-other in weekly master class sessions. Currently we are writing "Student Essentials" books.

4. Teachers who are employees (not renting space)

Generally most music studios "rent" out their lessons rooms to whichever teachers are willing to pay, regardless of credentials or musical background experience. [Not only is Lucci Music the only school that actually screens, then hires top professionals](#), but we also have lessons coordinators to take care of all inquiries, scheduling, and payments. It may seem like a small improvement, however, this allows our teachers to focus completely on you and prepare lesson plans before-hand without distractions.

5. Length and quality in teaching experience

It is important for your teacher to not only have at least 3-5 years teaching full time under his/her belt, but to also have [had quality mentorship and experience](#) teaching in school, class, group, and clinic settings.
